- 1. Introductions
 - a. Approval of agenda: motion to approve, KT; 2nd, SK; carried.
 - b. Approval of May 2011 minutes: motion to approve, CB; 2nd, SR; carried
- 2. Regular reports
 - a. Good News Sharing:
 - Grades 7/8/9 band concert was excellent, as was the 5/6 choir (KT);
 - Construction not as disruptive to teaching as feared (KP);
 - Students are able to get outside sooner at lunch hour with the nicer weather (RD);
 - Science Day was a big hit again (SL).
 - b. Principal's Report:
 - Just learned Mme Hellmer has accepted a full-time position at HGI; search for a new band teacher is underway. It is unlikely the new hire will be French-speaking (there is only one French-speaking band teacher in the division); the quality of musical instruction will be the priority.
 - ACTION: after consulting with Mme Hellmer, JA will ensure she is recognized on Awards Day (June 29).
 - The same band courses will be offered next year as this year (minus grade 9, obviously); JA pointed out that EVA offers more hours per week in band than other schools;
 - Students don't know yet; no decision yet on how the news will be delivered;
 - The band has been recorded playing "Oh! Canada"; this recording will be added to the repertoire of versions played in the morning;

- The new hire for resource, Chantal Proulx, also has applied for the position of VP at St. Avila and if she gets that, we will be looking for a new full-time resource person.
- c. Treasurer's Report:
 - Detailed report available upon request;
 - It was noted that half the money raised by fundraising was a result of the efforts of Fred Nash; the other half came from Lunch Lady; thank you to Fred and to Gail McIntosh (who organized Lunch Lady);
 - The milk program should net about \$1,000 by the end of June, after beginning two years ago with a deficit;
 - Motion to approve the report by CS; 2nd by JL; carried.
- d. School Grounds Transformation Committee Report:
 - Committee has a treasurer: Chris Lepa. Thank you, Chris!
 - Once Chris has opened a bank account for the committee, the money from the Sobeys fundraiser can be transferred into it;
 - Committee met with Wendy Simonson, a landscape architect for Toyota Evergreen who is a consultant to PTSD; committee is examining using her services to help with planning, fundraising and design and execution of the plan for the new school grounds;
 - Peak of the Market fundraiser: looks like a good fit for the committee participants receive Manitoba vegetables and half the proceeds go to the fundraising body; motion that the ACSL approve holding this fundraiser twice between September and December 2011 with all the proceeds going to the SGTC: SK; 2nd, CS; carried.
 - Anyone with an interest in SGTC, please consider joining the committee still in need of a president and a secretary, as well as members at large.
- e. Lunch Program Report:
 - Eating in the classrooms and then going outside as soon as students are done is working well for everybody;
 - Can this structure be considered for next year (CS)? Possibly; it depends on staffing but RD will think about it and talk it over with the other supervisors;
 - 30 minutes in the multi-purpose rooms is too long (JA);
 - Discussion re: open vs. closed campus. How does the open campus affect the greatre community? Do the students see it as an entitlement, or a privilege? Can students be allowed to leave with parental consent? Would it affect lunch staffing? Can there be parental input into the decision? (GM, JA, JL, Pam W, RD, ES, JT)

- It ultimately will be the new principal's decision (JA).
- f. Milk Program:
 - Still needs someone to run it next year; the system is in place, the volunteer really just needs to be a trouble shooter (CS).
- 3. Old Business:
 - Some outstanding committees that never got off the ground or reported to the ACSL from this year: School of Choice, Awards, Student Voice
- 4. New Business:
 - a. Cash awards for Grade 9s:
 - The purpose was to recognize academic excellence but wasn't seen as a fair distribution of ACSL's resources (i.e. the money only went to a few grade 9 students);
 - Committee was struck this year to examine the issue but never followed through;
 - This is an awkward year because there are two graduating/departing classes;
 - Discussion re: to give the awards this year or not? Should we move to more visible honour roll system? (CD, SL, Pam W, CS)
 - Motion that a committee be struck to review the awards structure and that the ACSL accept its recommendations, to be submitted no later than Friday, June 17: motion by Pam W; 2nd CS; carried.
