c. Principals' Report

- i. *A detailed Principal's report was handed out and reviewed by Shannon Tipping (see Appendix A attached at the end of these minutes)*
 - *Several items to highlight including sharing of the school plan. Priorities include school culture with a focus on respect, engagement in French, promoting French culture, institutional data, social engagement, academic engagement, technology (how to use, digital citizenship), social buddies, literacy (want to have all students reading at grade level by end of year – had 85% reading at grade level last year), computation skills.*
 - *Ron Monin outlined a human rights project promoting the Convention on the Rights of the Child, planned for spring 2015. A video was shown introducing the project which will involve thousands of students preparing 8 1/2 by 11 panels to be laid out in the Investor's Field stadium to form the shape of the CRC logo and filmed from above.*

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PRINCIPAL'S SCHOOL REPORT MONDAY, NOVEMBER 10, 2014

School Information:

School Plan/Budget: Items shared at the November meeting.

Class Profiles: In the month of October and November, we have been reviewing our Strong Beginnings information to develop class profiles. Using this information, we are able to determine where to best place our resources to support student learning.

Respect Work: Marie Geelen, an educational consultant from Ontario, worked with all students to start developing respect agreements for our school. All students had a voice and were engaged in the process of what we wanted respect to look like at Ecole Viscount Alexander. Each grade levels' responses were collated and will be shared with us in the near future. Further work will be on-going throughout the year. A staff committee will be also working on developing this within our school plan.

TTFM (Tell Them From Me): Students across the school will be participating in an on-line survey entitled Tell Them From Me. There are two surveys one for the younger grades (Grades 5/6) and one for the older grades (Grade 7/8). The information that is collated using this data and this provides us with information from students on how they see our school, areas we need to focus on and assist us with the development of our school plan and initiatives. The students will be participating in the survey prior to December 12.

Capital Improvements Meeting with the Division: Each year the Principal meets with the division to review the facility needs. On November 20, Chantal and I will meet with the divisional facility representatives. Our main priorities for the school are painting, lighting, and discussing about enhancing our science lab.

Parent-student-teacher conferences: Conferences were held the evening of October 14th and October 16th, as well as the morning of October 17. Conferences were either 10 or 15 minutes depending on the grade level. There was also an opportunity to meet specialist teachers. Thank you to all of the families that took time to meet with staff to discuss your child's academic progress. We had some positive feedback about the conferences. If there is any additional feedback, please do not hesitate to share this with us.

Community Building: In November, students will be starting to participate in our family advisory groups which will be meeting once a month. Each group will have students from Grade 5 to 8. This integrated group will be focusing on developing responsible digital citizenship in our school using the Common Sense Media website. Common Sense Media is a non-profit organization that provides education and advocacy to families to promote safe technological and media use for children. The lessons from the website facilitate discussions and activities based on this topic.

Remembrance Day Assembly: Thank you to all parents that attended our Remembrance Day assembly this morning. Grade 5 students from Mme Pepler's class created Remembrance Day collages which they

presented at the assembly. Our Grade 5 and 6 choir shared a musical selection and representatives from each grade level read poems in French and English. A Canadian Forces member, Captain McCulloch-Drake also addressed our students, staff and visitors.

Étoile du Mois: At each of our monthly assemblies, students are highlighted and awarded the Étoile du Mois (Star of the Month) for each class. Students are awarded a certificate and then their photo is taken for our bulletin board in the hallway. This year we have also been introducing a theme each month that will be the focus of the awards. The themes are based on Character Education themes. So far, our themes have been September – Responsibility, October – Respect, November – Courage, December – Empathy.

Band Camp: The Grade 8 band students along with Mme Nowostawski and three other staff members (Mr. Bissonnette, Mme Leclercq, Mme Lerner), went to Camp Assiniboia to work with clinicians during the annual band camp. Students had a wonderful time not only fine tuning their musical abilities but also participating in camp activities. A huge thank you is extended to Mme Nowostawski for organizing such a wonderful event.

Art Days: While the Grade 8 band students were focusing on their musical skills, the art students were working on their art abilities and techniques with artists at school. The first day, Grade 8 students were joined by the Grade 7 art students to participate in a workshop from Tipi Creations that focused on soap stone sculpture. Students worked at carving pieces of soap stone to create pendants, etc. The second day, students worked with our divisional art consultant, Mr. Cameron Cross, who created plaster gauze masks with them. This was highlighted on the divisional website twitter feed. A special thank you is extended Ms. Dombek who organized this project for our students.

Atelier Jazz performed at the WJO: Atelier Jazz group of Grade 8 students performed prior to the WJO performance yesterday at the WAG, as well as during the intermission. Students participated in a workshop the day prior to the performance and were wonderful representatives for Ecole Viscount Alexander.

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Artist in the School: Last week Grade 5 and 6 classes worked with Mme Leigh-Anne Kehler who has been assisting students at writing their script for the winter concert. This year the concert will be the “Wizard of Odd” and all of the class plays will be focused around this theme. This program was financed from our school budget.

Cinema francais: In October all students participated in a French film from Quebec Cinema. This was financed partly by the division through a French language grant and partially from the school. Grade 7 students also attended a French film at Cinmental as well.

Improvisation: Grade 7 classes will be participating in improvisation workshops in the month of November. The facilitator is from Fort Richmond Collegiate. This will be partially subsidized by the school and students will be bringing \$1.00 for the remainder of the cost.

Bells at lunch: Due to teacher contract indicating a one hour duty free lunch, we changed our lunch bell to 12:30 pm at the beginning of this year. However, teachers are noticing that students are taking their time entering after lunch and miss some of the instructional time during the first period of the afternoon. Therefore, starting next week we are going to have a bell ring at 12:25 pm and the lunch monitors will supervise students until 12:30 pm. We hope that this will provide enough information for students to prepare for class prior to 12:30 start.

Fundraising Initiatives:

- Parent Council Peak of the Market campaign with proceeds going to the Band program. Delivery date is November 18.
- Poinsettia sales are currently underway. This is a fundraising initiative and poinsettias that are sold will go into the students account for those students that sell the items. Staff members that sell items the funds go into a fund to assist students with financial challenges.
- Mom's Pantry fundraiser is also for student accounts.

Professional Development:

- October 17 in the afternoon, staff participated in a discussion facilitated by Dr. Michael Wodlinger regarding the new divisional Standard of Behaviour document.
- October 24 teachers participated in provincial educational groups. Some members of staff remained at school to focus on developing our use of Google Apps and Google Classroom with students.
- Teachers are currently organizing Professional Learning Communities (PLC) to focus on various areas of our school plan – Literacy, Numeracy, Technology, School Culture

Divisional Initiatives:

Girlz Jam: Five Grade 8 students participated in an all day workshop focusing on healthy relationships, body acceptance, and anti-bullying. This is a divisional initiative that took place at Westwood Community Church. It is a workshop that allows learning and growing opportunities for young women and inspires them to reach their full potential.

WE Day: Students from École Viscount Alexander attended the We Day presentation at the MTS Center on October 29 with Mme Hillman, Mr. Monin and Mme Tipping. Students returned very enthusiastic and focused on making a change and a difference in the world. They have recently completed the We Scare Hunger initiative where they collected over 350 items for various baskets that have been donated to Winnipeg Harvest. Thank you to all families that assisted us with this initiative. The We Day students are discussing and starting to organize various other initiatives for the school year.

Human Rights Project: Our divisional Art Consultant, Mr. Cameron Cross, along with Mr. David Wall, Educational Technological Consultant, are organizing a Human Rights project for our divisional staff and students. A video to be presented at the meeting.

OTHER SCHOOL EVENTS

Grade 5 Viking Trip: Grade 5 students, as part of their Social Studies unit, participated in a Viking Day activity.

Mad Science: Mad Science started in October and will continue for eight weeks. This is a program for interested Grades 5 and 6 students.

Club de Badminton: Mme Joffrin has organized a badminton club for Grade 7 and 8 students' afterschool on Fridays.

Volleyball Teams: Volleyball season will be concluding in the next few weeks. Grades 7 and 8 teams have been participating in several games and tournaments over the season. Grade 6 students will be participating in a tournament at Chancellor School on November 24 and 25. Thank you to all the staff and parent volunteer coaches for their time coaching our students.

Yearbook: Last year we had a yearbook published and this year we will be focusing on creating a yearbook.

Koats for Kids: Mme Marriott has organized the Koats for Kids initiatives in our schools to allow our school community to reach out to other students in need in Winnipeg. We will have a box in the main hall by the office for anyone that would like to donate to this worthy cause.

June – Life Days – Teachers are starting to explore an initiative where students can be involved with various activities and interests for the last week of school. Friday will be Fun Mountain and other activities being explored will be activities such as golf, quilting, cooking, camping, and the possibility of a Grade 7 trip to Quebec. As this is the last week of June and it's difficult to organize buses, we may need the assistance of parents or volunteers to assist us. For some of the activities a fee may be required. Student accounts can be used for these activities.
